## FAQ's

### **What is Dual Enrollment?**

- Dual Enrollment is when a high school student takes a college course offered at their high school while still in high school.

### **Why should I take Dual Enrollment classes?**

- Strategy to enhance HS to college transition
- Provides access to students who may not otherwise attend college
- Better prepared students in foundational courses
- Motivation to pursue a college certificate or degree
- Confidence in academic ability
- Accelerated pathway through college that can save time and money
- Pathway to college and student success

### **What is the cost?**

- There are **no costs** with Dual Enrollment. Books and tuition are provided for free.

### **What classes are offered?**

- College CTE pathway courses and general education courses are offered. If your goal is to attend a 4-year college, your Norco College Ed Advisor can ensure that you take courses that are transferable to a CSU or UC.

### **Who teaches dual enrollment courses?**

- Dual enrollment courses are taught by instructors that meet the qualifications of the California Community College System.

### **How rigorous are dual enrollment classes?**

- Each dual enrollment class is a state approved collegiate course, whether it is an academic course or a career technical education course.

### **Can I receive high school credit for taking dual enrollment courses?**

- Yes. The student can earn both high school and college credit. To determine how a college course fulfills a high school requirement, see your high school counselor.
