At Norco High School we want to empower parents with tools to effectively monitor their student's academic progress.

STUDENTS should:

- Attend school daily and show up to each class on time.
- Get Organized! Use a planner or calendar to keep track of assignments, tests, and due dates. If need be, have your teachers sign off on it to confirm accuracy. Clean out your backpack weekly and look for assignments that should have been turned in.
- Respect yourself and others; students who leave class frequently are missing out on academic instruction and peer collaboration.
- Q Student Connect – Check it regularly. Be proactive about your work, don't play catch up.
- Academic Saturday School - Attend as needed for support. Weekly schedules are posted in classrooms and on social media.

PARENTS support your student by:

- Q Parent Connect - Use Q Parent Connect to identify any trends in your student's work habits that might be contributing to poor grades. You may also notice trends with performance on tests and quizzes. You can find the log in page at <https://parentconnect.cnusd.k12.ca.us/>.
- If you need to retrieve your pin or password, please call the registrar's office at 951-736-3241.
- The Q "Pulse" report will give you a quick summary of your students grades, attendance and missing assignments in each class

ACTION

CONTACT TEACHER

The purpose of this meeting is the first step to address questions or concerns regarding academics, behavior, or social needs. Communication can be in-person, phone, email, or zoom.

TIMELINE: AS NEEDED

PERSON(S) RESPONSIBLE: PARENT/TEACHER

2

ACTION

PARENT-TEACHER-COUNSELOR CONFERENCE (PTC)

The purpose is for parents, teachers, counselors, and student to discuss a student's progress in academics, behavioral, or social areas. Goals and outcomes are communicated to student and parents.

TIMELINE: 2-4 WEEKS AFTER ACTION 1

PERSON(S) RESPONSIBLE: COUNSELOR

3

ACTION

STUDENT STUDY TEAM MEETING (SST)

The SST Team consists of teachers, parent(s), student, psychologist, and counselor. The purpose of the meeting is to plan interventions that will lead to improved student achievement who may be struggling in academic, behavioral or social areas.

TIMELINE: 4-6 WEEKS AFTER ACTION 2

PERSON(S) RESPONSIBLE: COUNSELORS

4

ACTION

504 MEETING

A student qualifies for an initial 504 meeting by having one of the following: (1) have a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities; or (2) have a record of such an impairment; or (3) be regarded as having such an impairment. **504 meeting can take place after or before action 1.

TIMELINE: 4-6 WEEKS AFTER ACTION 3

PERSON(S) RESPONSIBLE: AP CLERKS

ACTION

INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATIONAL PLAN MEETING (IEP)

This is a plan or program developed to ensure that a child with an identified disability who is attending a secondary educational institution receives specialized instruction and related services. **IEP meeting can take place after or before action 1 upon parent request.

TIMELINE: **WITHIN 75 DAYS (15 DAYS TO RESPOND WITH AN ASSESSMENT PLAN AND 60 DAYS TO HOLD IEP MEETING)

Norco High School Attendance & Tardy Policy

ABSENCE

A parent/guardian is required to call the Attendance Office as soon as they know their student will not be attending school. Absences not cleared within 10 days will be recorded as an unexcused/truancy and Saturday School will be issued for the student.

LATE ARRIVAL

Students are to report to a security attendant upon arriving at school and their attendance record will be amended at that time. An excused tardy requires a note from parent/guardian.

Oversleeping, missing the bus, traffic, car problems, etc. are not considered valid reasons for excused tardies.

EARLY DISMISSAL

Students must be signed out by parents or guardians. Parent/Guardian must call the Attendance Office after 7:45 a.m. indicating the time and reason the student needs to leave campus. The Attendance Office will produce an early dismissal pass that the student will need to show their teacher. The teacher will release the student at the designated time, and the student should report to the Attendance Office where they will wait for the parent/guardian. If the student drives it should be indicated on the early dismissal pass and the student will be allowed to sign themselves out prior to leaving.

Cut off time for checking out a student early is 3:00 pm
(30 minutes prior to the bell at the end of the day) - no exceptions.

TARDY POLICY & PROCEDURES

Students are expected to be on time to school. Students are considered tardy if they are not inside their classroom when the tardy/passing bell rings. Tardy students must sign in with a security attendant or at the Attendance Office if tardy. Students will be subject to disciplinary action. Tardiness applies before school, between classes, and after lunch.

****All detention hours MUST be cleared within 1 school day of receiving and MUST be cleared in order to attend a school rally or school dance.**

TARDY SWEEP LOCKOUTS

Students who get caught in a tardy lockout will receive a 1 hour detention. Lockouts are randomly scheduled and can happen any day and during any class period.

CNUSD Dress Code Policy [5132](#) (revised April 2023)

The following minimum standards shall be enforced in the Corona-Norco Unified School District in order to meet the requirements of the California Code of Regulations regarding grooming, dress, and appearance and the Education Code regarding free expression. We have organized the dress code policy into two sections so that students and their families understand the acceptable and unacceptable standards of student dress.

Students Must Wear

- Dress that is suitable and safe for school activities. Clothing should correspond with the demands and purpose of the activity and/or course in which students participate.
- Shirt/Top/Dress (must have at least one strap to secure over the shoulder or neck during school and school-sponsored activities) Top apparel shall be worn at an appropriate/acceptable length for the demands and purposes of the activity and/or course in which students participate.
- Pants/Sweatpants/Shorts/Skirt/Dress (that fully cover undergarments and private areas)
- Shoes: activity-specific shoes are required for physical education (PE) and co-curricular activities. Elementary students must have straps on the back of all shoes.
- Attire for activities as part of a specific curriculum (for example, job/career readiness, JROTC) Bathing suits and athletic uniforms should only be worn in designated areas for specific sports activities.
- Students shall be allowed to wear sun-protective clothing, including school-appropriate hats and sunglasses for outdoor use during the school day, without a physician's note or prescription.

Students Cannot Wear

- Clothing or accessories with the following images or language are prohibited:
 - Violence
 - depicts drugs or alcohol (or any illegal item or activity) or their use
 - includes hate speech, profanity, or pornography (including symbols)
 - is likely to create a hostile or intimidating environment based on any protected class
 - is obscene, libelous, or slanderous
 - clothing that serves to incite students as to create a clear and present danger
- Visible undergarments are prohibited.
- Undergarments and swimwear of similar design worn as outerwear are prohibited.
- Sunglasses are not permitted in indoor spaces.
- Headwear or clothing that obscures the face (except as a religious observance or health/safety-related guidelines, including health and safety facial coverings) are prohibited.
- In consultation with law enforcement or other gang experts, the school administration may limit clothing or apparel where there is a reasonable basis for identifying such clothing or apparel where a gang is affiliated. Limitations and prohibitions will be applied equally to all students. In no instance will a student's clothing or apparel be identified as gang-related based on the student's race, national origin, or ancestry.

A student who violates the dress code shall be subject to progressive interventions. Dress code violations should be resolved quickly to reduce loss of instructional time and addressed privately with individual students. No academic grade of a student shall be adversely affected based on noncompliance with the dress code, except Physical Education when failure to wear appropriate apparel arises from circumstances within the student's control. (See EC Section 49066(c)).

School sites will implement the following progressive interventions for dress code violations:

- Warning and self-correct dress code violation
- Offer students a change of nondescript and/or school-specific clothing
- Offer parent/guardian the opportunity to bring a change of clothes
- Repeated violations may result in a parent-school conference and/or other means of correction

CNUSD Electronic Signaling Device (Cell Phone) Policy [5334](#)

Students may possess any electronic signaling device that operates through the transmission or receipt of radio waves, including but not limited to cellular phones while on campus, attending school-sponsored activities, or under the supervision and control of school district employees. Such devices shall be turned off in class, except when being used for a valid instructional or other school-related purpose as determined by the teacher or other district employee, and at any other time directed by a district employee. Any device with camera, video, or voice recording function shall not be used in any manner which infringes on the privacy rights of any other person.

No student will be prohibited from possessing or using an electronic signaling device that is determined by a licensed physician and surgeon to be essential for the health of the pupil and the use of which is limited to purposes related to the health of the pupil.

Consequences for Violation of Cell Phone Policy

If a student is found to be in violation of the Cell Phone Policy to include headphones or earbuds, the consequences will be as follows:

*4th and future offenses: Parent/guardian will be contacted to pick up the cell phone from school. If the parent is unable to pick up the phone from school at that time, the option to hold the cell phone in a secure location will be provided until which time the parent is able to come to campus and retrieve the device(s).
