How you are graded



Grading:

You will be assessed and evaluated on meeting course standards in speaking, listening, reading and writing. Research has shown that success is based on daily practice and memorization. If there is no specific homework assignment on a given day, students should be reviewing notes and vocabulary for the current unit for a minimum of 10-15 minutes per day. Final grades are based on points. Extra credit cannot exceed more than five percent of your grade. Student Connect is updated DAILY. Final grades are determined as follows:

Interpersonal/Presentational/Communication

10 points/daily

Points may/will be deducted if you:

- ✓ are not actively participating in class
- misuse of electronics (phone/computer)
- ✓ talk at inappropriate times
- ✓ not using the target language
- ✓ tardy to class
- ✓ abuse of bathroom privilege
- ✓ listening to music during instruction
